We travel! If transportation is an issue, please ask us about bringing a hands-on workshop to you!



Jump for Joy

Pre-K to 2nd Grade

1st Grade

Become the characters as folktales are told from around the world. Travel to: China, West Africa, the Caribbean and eastern Europe with Riki Tiki Tembo, Who's in Rabbit's House?, Trouble, and the Great Big Enormous Turnip. Make a paper bag puppet to take home. Nature's Where and When

2nd Grade

3rd Grade

4th Grade

Meet a famous Maryland conductor of the Underground Railroad. Learn how the Quaker church got involved in stealing the property of plantation owners. Groups of more than 75 students can schedule more than one date, or same day morning and afternoon sessions. We can recommend other sites to visit in Annapolis. Add 1/2 hour to your visit if you bring lunch.

Pricing

Pre-K to 3rd grade: 1-hour workshop plus 1 hour to explore the museum: \$13 per student, minimum 16 students.
4th to 5th grade: 90-min. workshop, includes a snack as part of the program: \$15 per student, minimum 16 students.
1 chaperone is free for every 5 students. Extra adults are \$8 each.

Workshops to go:

In Anne Arundel County: \$200 per hour per facilitator. (Lead On, Harriet! requires 2 facilitators.) Add a travel fee of \$10 per 10 minutes beyond.

Title 1 & AAA schools:

Grants and volunteers enable us to reduce fees at times if you serve low-income families.

Deposit:

A non-refundable \$25 deposit will be credited to your total.. Balance is due on the day of your workshop.
